



Trexler legacy under threat

PHLT seeks to save Scout camp from development

Harry Trexler was a man of many interests.

Starting in the late 1800s, he founded or ran huge operations in and around Allentown: a nationally-known lumber company, one of the largest cement producers in the world, enormous farms and orchards. He was even a founder of Pennsylvania Power and Light.

Harry Trexler was an industry giant, extremely wealthy ... and at the same time, a dedicated, conservation-minded man.

He was the father of Allentown's public park system, owner of a trout hatchery, creator of the Trexler Game Preserve, and an avid outdoorsman who devoted huge sums to conserve land for the public to use and enjoy.

YOU SHOULD KNOW

If Camp Trexler land were converted to housing, dozens of homes could be built there under current zoning. In addition to traffic, road damage, sewage, and water issues, each school-age child would add \$22,000 to the school district's costs. Property taxes on the new construction would fall far short of that; shortfalls would be made up by other taxpayers.

If Camp Trexler land were converted to industrial use, such as a transfer station, heavy equipment like trash haulers would burden traffic and roads, create noise and air pollution, and damage quality of life for everyone.

For more than 30 years, Pocono Heritage Land Trust has helped landowners protect their property for the future. The land trust itself also holds more than 4,000 acres, protected in perpetuity. Camp Trexler adjoins land that the land trust has already conserved. Join us. Help protect this rare and beautiful place! For information: phlt.org.

Save Camp Trexler

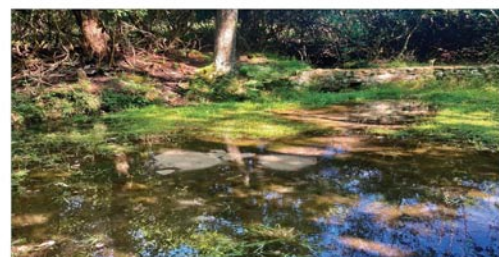

He bought and preserved the land that would become Hickory Run State Park, one of the jewels of our state park system, welcoming 300,000 visitors a year.

In 1928, he — helped by neighboring families — donated 755 acres of springs, wetlands, wildlife and woodlands in Polk Township to be a wilderness camp, run by the Boy Scouts, for the benefit of future generations.

Camp Trexler still exists, one of the last stretches of pristine woodland in the township. But its founders' vision is under threat.

After 94 years, the place where thousands of Scouts made lifetime memories — hiking, fishing, learning to "be prepared," to tell the truth and keep promises — may be going up for sale.

It could become a housing development. A trash transfer station. It could be clear-cut and timbered, instead of remaining the beautiful, wild land Harry

Trexler and neighboring farmers intended.

There is another option.

Pocono Heritage Land Trust is working to acquire this property, conserve it permanently, and keep it open to the public.

No McMansions. No industry. Just the priceless land itself, a legacy of natural beauty for generations to come, as the donors envisioned.

Minsi Trails Council of the Boy Scouts of America makes the decisions about this land. It is up to the board members to choose the path to the future.

Will they be true to the principles of Scouting and keep faith with the givers of this special place? Will they honor all those whose lifelong memories of camping here consecrate this land? Will the promise of Camp Trexler be kept?

Or not?

PLEASE DONATE to preserve important lands and natural resources in the Poconos, for generations to come.

\$25 provides supplies for one trash cleanup day, or one planting of wildflower seeds for meadow habitat restoration.
\$50 buys tools for managing invasive plants on volunteer days.
\$150 prints 500 trail brochures to guide visitors on preserves.

\$1,500 covers the cost of an appraisal, the first step in acquiring new land for preservation.
\$3,000 funds construction of a sign kiosk on a new preserve.
\$5,000 enables development of a new nature trail network, including trail marking, clearing, signage and maps.

If so, register for kindergarten and follow these three steps:

Gather Your Documents

1. Parent/Guardian Photo Identification
2. Proof of child's birth date
3. Two Proofs of Residency

One proof from List A:

- Mortgage agreement
- Lease agreement
- Rent payment receipts (with address)
- Property tax payment receipts
- Moving permit

One proof from List B:

- Utility bill with current address (dated within the last 3 months)
- Paycheck stub with employer and employee's address
- Current voter registration with Bangor residency address
- PA Driver's license with Bangor residency address
- PA vehicle registration with Bangor residency address

5. Physical Exam Record
6. Dental Exam Record

Attend Screening Appointment

Kindergarten screening appointments for the 2023-2024 school year are in June.

All screenings are by appointment only, and are only scheduled when the online registration process is complete and approved by the registration secretary. Completed packets must be received and approved no later than May 19, 2023 to guarantee a June screening appointment.

- Photo identification to verify parent/guardian identity.
- Any other updated documents.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION WELCOME CLASS OF 2036!

The Bangor Area School District (BASD) is excited to welcome the Class of 2036! The kindergarten team at Five Points Elementary School is looking forward to working with our new kindergarten class for the 2023-2024 School Year. A child is eligible for kindergarten if he/she

- is at least the age of five (5) years by August 28, 2023.
- resides within the boundaries of BASD.
- successfully completes the district's kindergarten screening process.

Kindergarten registration is online. Online kindergarten registration is available for parents and/or guardians through the district website (www.bangorslaters.com). Once packets are received and confirmed complete, BASD will contact parents/guardians to schedule a kindergarten screening appointment in June of 2023. Completed packets must be received no later than May 19, 2023, to guarantee a screening appointment in June. A completed registration includes:

- Parent/Guardian Photo Identification
- Proof of child's birth date (must be at least five (5) years by August 28, 2023)
- Two (2) proofs of residency
- Immunizations
- Physical Exam Record
- Dental Exam Record

To schedule a screening appointment, the completed online registration and mandatory documents must be submitted and approved by the registration secretary. Kindergarten screenings for the 2023-2024 School Year will occur in June of 2023. All screenings are by appointment only. An adult must accompany the child for their screening appointment. Our kindergarten staff is eager to meet and work with your child!
