

Local Veteran And His Wife Displaced For Nine Months Due To Tragic Fire In Upper Mt. Bethel

UMBТ - A local veteran Pete Reisen and his wife Ingrid were tragically displaced for nine months two weeks ago from a fire that ripped thru their home in Upper Mt. Bethel (UMBТ). "They said we would have to find housing for nine months till the house would be fully repaired" said Reisen. On Sunday Members of UMBТ held a fund-raiser for money, food and household items for the couple. "We want to help Pete and his wife get thru this. "Pete has been instrumental to helping a lot of others in this community over the years, now it's time for us to help him" said John Bermingham UMBТ Chair Board of Supervisors. Other members of UMBТ who were there in support were David Friedman UMBТ Supervisor & Nick Graziano UMBТ Manager.

Mission of Love Food Hub in Bangor has reached out to the couple to assist them in their time of need with food.

Slate Belt Veterans Assoc. members Toni Lynch and Michael Ortoski were their to present a check to the couple for \$500, Pete (the 'God-father' of UMBТ) as he was nicknamed years ago by the community is a veteran who served in the U.S. Army for most of the 1960s.

Reisen born in 1939, Reisen moved to Upper Mount Bethel with his family when he was a year old. He began working as a volunteer firefighter with the Mount Bethel Fire Co. in 1969, and has spent his entire life living and serving in the township.
