Defending School Choice for Pennsylvania Families

The House recently voted on legislation that makes significant changes to Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs.

I voted no on House Bill 2632 because I believe every child deserves access to the educational setting that best meets their needs, regardless of their family's income. For years, these scholarship programs have helped thousands of students access educational opportunities that may otherwise have been out of reach.

While House Bill 2632 is being promoted as a transparency measure, I am concerned that it would fundamentally reshape these successful programs and make it more difficult for many families to benefit from them. In particular, I believe the bill moves Pennsylvania away from expanding school choice and toward limiting educational options for middle-income families who do not qualify for traditional assistance programs but still struggle with the rising cost of education.

Parents know their children best. They should have the freedom to choose the educational environment that works for their family, whether that is a public school, private school, parochial school, charter school or another option that meets their child's needs.

Pennsylvania should be working to expand educational opportunities, not create new barriers for families seeking them. That is why I voted no on House Bill 2632, and I will continue to support policies that put students and families first.
