

Grand Central Landfill Hosts Fire Companies for Training Night

PEN ARGYL - Nearly 50 men and women visited the Grand Central Landfill throughout September for special trainings focused on emergency management and fire safety. The Grand Central Landfill hosted area fire companies as part as an annual training session.

The group included firemen from Wind Gap, Pen Argyl (Lookout Fire Company #1) and Bushkill Township.

The visit included a detailed discussion about Waste Management's Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fleet and how to handle any potential emergencies. Brian Stahl, a Grand Central Hauling truck driver, Maintenance Manager Matthew Gibas and Maintenance Supervisor Bruce Archer provided the instruction and demonstration for the emergency features on the CNG fleet.

Brian is no amateur when it comes to Waste Management's trucks. He has spent 27 years with Grand Central Hauling and equally the same amount of time as a fireman. He serves as the Fire Chief for Bushkill Township Fire Company – one of the emergency crews that would service Grand Central Landfill.

Grand Central's Landfill Manager, Joe Statile and Sr. Community Relations Specialist, Adrienne Fors provided a detailed explanation of the facility in the parking lot at the office. Due to COVID, the team couldn't tour the facility on the bus like previous years, but Joe and Adrienne happily explained key components of the facility. The discussion included the facility's' landfill gas-to-energy project and the Grand Central Wastewater Treatment Plant.
