PEN ARGYL - According to the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. During one year, this equates to more than 10 million women and men. An estimated one in four women and one in nine men will be subjected to abuse by an intimate partner.

Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive behavior used to establish power and control over an intimate partner, causing both physical and emotional harm. Victims may be subjected to abuse, harassment, threats, vandalism, trespassing, burglary, theft and stalking.

As one of the most chronically underreported crimes, domestic violence affects men and women in all racial, ethnic, religious, educational, social and economic backgrounds.

As a member of the PA Brain Injury Coalition we work diligently in bipartisan with all four Co-Chairs of the Brain Injury Caucus.

At the Main Rotunda, Tim Brigg (D), House of Representatives, 149th District will speak on the NEW Legislation, House Bill 1682, coverage for post-acute Neurorehabilitation for individuals who sustained a brain injury.

Ann founded Hope Foundation in 2008 in memory of her daughter, Lauren, who was only four years old when she passed away sustaining an Acquired Brain Injury.

Senator Tim Kearney (D), 26th District and Senator Ryan Aument (R), 39th District will speak at the Reception. Kevin McDonald and Melissa Carmen will give an inspirational testimony on recovery after brain injury.



Monitoring the recording of documents/instruments in your name can help alert you to something that is fraudulent and could cost you one of your most valuable assets, your property.

Implementation of New Record Alert System

EASTON - The Northampton County Department of Fiscal Affairs announced that the Recorder of Deeds office is now offering a new Record Alert System for property owners in Northampton County. The Alert System is free of charge to anyone who would like to sign up for the service.

The Record Alert System monitors recorded activity against the name and parcel ID of a property owner. Those signed up for the program will receive real-time alerts from the recording vendor, LANDEX, whenever changes are made to their deeds, mortgages, or other recordable documents, whether legitimate or fraudulent. Businesses are also welcome to sign up for this service.

"Northampton County is taking a significant step to combat theft for our property owners," says County Executive Lamont G. McClure. "County residents can look into the LANDEX webstore for free to see what activity was recorded. If a document is presented properly, signed, and acknowledged, the Recorder of Deeds is obligated to record it. If a document is on record that residents did not authorize, residents can look into it further."
