
Standing United Against Political Violence

The bottom line is this: Political violence has no place in America. It is a violation of the very principles this country was founded on. Dangerous acts of political violence must be unequivocally condemned and prosecuted, regardless of political affiliation.

On September 10th, my friend Charlie Kirk was murdered in an act of political violence. Charlie stood for truth, faith, and freedom, and his voice inspired a new generation to stand boldly for their beliefs. He lived a life worth celebrating, and we remember him with deep gratitude. It was an honor to be at the White House to witness President Trump posthumously award Charlie Kirk the Presidential Medal of Freedom. As Erika so powerfully said, Charlie lived only 31 short years. But he lived every single day with courage and purpose.

Earlier this year, an arsonist set fire to our Governor's residence in an act of political violence. I'll say it again and again: political violence has no place in our country. This week, the arsonist pled guilty, and the Governor rightly reminded us that we cannot grow numb to this. Regardless of your political beliefs, violence is never the answer. We must stand united in condemning it.
