The FY26 NDAA focuses on readiness, modernization, and support for those who serve by:

- Providing a 3.8% pay raise for enlisted servicemembers

- Developing new and innovative defense technologies to meet global threats
- Accelerating space and missile defense capabilities to protect American interests

Fighting to Prevent Maternal Deaths

This week, I spoke at a bipartisan Congressional briefing focused on a heartbreaking reality: maternal and infant mortality rates in the U.S. remain far too high, and in many cases, those tragedies are preventable. In fact, research from Harvard shows that 80% of maternal deaths can be prevented with the right care and support.

This issue has been a priority for me since my time in the Pennsylvania State House, where I authored the law that created our state's first Maternal Mortality Review Committee — bringing together medical and maternal health experts to study real cases and develop strategies that save lives.

Now in Congress, I'm continuing that work by cosponsoring the bipartisan Preventing Maternal Deaths Reauthorization Act, which would:

- Renew federal support for maternal mortality review committees,
- Strengthen data collection across states, and
- Promote evidence-based practices that improve care for women and infants.

I'll keep fighting to ensure every woman has access to quality maternal care, every family is supported, and every preventable loss is met with action.
