

Boscola Announces \$183,333 Grant To Further Expand Apprenticeship Programs In The Lehigh Valley

BETHLEHEM (DEC 23, 2022) – State Senator Lisa M. Boscola announced today that the Lehigh Valley Workforce Investment Board was awarded a \$183,333 grant for its Lehigh Valley Apprenticeship Consortium-Industrial Training and Education Consortium (iTEC) by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry.

“Apprenticeship programs play a critical role in meeting the demand of Lehigh Valley employers for meeting the needs of a skilled workforce for the 21st century economy,” Senator Boscola stated. “The Lehigh Valley Apprentice Consortium will provide apprenticeship programs throughout our region to allow for pathways for job seekers to enter into future job opportunities with high-growth career outcomes.”

This funding will allow the Lehigh Valley Workforce Investment Board to create and sustain a multi-employer registered apprenticeship model known as the Lehigh Valley Apprenticeship Consortium - Industrial Training and Education Consortium (iTEC). The Consortium will provide alternate career pathways for job seekers, students, and the community while targeting underrepresented individuals. This project will also allow regional educators and industries to offer apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship programs for high-growth career outcomes.

The Department of Labor & Industry announced grant awards totaling \$1.8 million for 9 local workforce development boards from funding received through the U.S. Department of Labor’s Apprenticeship Building America initiative to further expand Pennsylvania’s network of registered apprenticeship programs.



Boscola Announces \$296,396 Apprenticeship Grant Awarded To IBEW Local 375

BETHLEHEM (DEC 22, 2022) – State Senator Lisa M. Boscola announced today that a \$296,396 grant through Pennsylvania’s Pre-Apprentice and Apprenticeship Grant Program has been awarded to the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 375 Joint Apprenticeship and Training Fund in Allentown to provide training for 30 apprentices in the Lehigh Valley.

“Apprenticeship programs, such as the one at IBEW Local 375, play a critical role in ensuring the demand for top quality electricians schooled in fiber optics and other advanced technologies can be met here in the Lehigh Valley,” Senator Boscola stated. “This partnership between the Commonwealth and IBEW Local 375 will increase the number of apprentices trained by 15% over the next three years.”

IBEW Local 375’s program curriculum will focus on:

- telecommunications wiring and fiber optics to improve broadband access to rural and underserved areas of Pennsylvania;
- solar power;
- programmatic logic controls;
- power quality and power grid updates; safe job practices; and,
- the National Electrical Code.

IBEW Local 375 has a network of over 300 Lehigh Valley employers who have signed on with their program as partners. Once apprentices have completed the program, the focus will be on placement with one of those employers.

“IBEW Local 375 has an over 100-year record of proven performance and commitment to ensuring projects are done to the highest quality,” Senator Boscola added. “The state investment in their apprenticeship program will have an important impact on the Lehigh Valley for decades to come.”

The program assists with the related instruction that complements on the job training to deliver the technical and academic competencies that apply to the job.
