## Advocates Push to Improve Brain Injury Care

On Wednesday, I joined a bipartisan group of lawmakers and partners from the Rehabilitation and Community Providers Association for a press conference highlighting workforce shortages and funding challenges facing Pennsylvania's health and human services system, while also recognizing Brain Injury Awareness Month.

The event brought together providers and advocates from across the Commonwealth to discuss the need for stable funding, workforce support and long-term system improvements to ensure continued access to care.

Brain injuries affect individuals and families in profound ways, and many of these challenges are not immediately visible. As co-chair of the Pennsylvania Brain Injury Caucus, I am working to strengthen access to care, support providers and ensure treatments like cognitive rehabilitation therapy remain available to those who need it.

Providers across the Commonwealth continue to face staffing shortages and outdated reimbursement rates, making it difficult to serve patients. Today's discussion also highlighted key priorities, including implementing rate increases, reducing administrative burdens and monitoring changes at the federal level.

This issue is deeply personal to me. My daughter, Lauren, lived with a severe brain injury, and her strength continues to inspire my work advocating for better support and services. I will continue working with my colleagues to advance solutions that support providers and ensure Pennsylvanians receive the care they need.
